**Abstract:** The abstract should be typed in the same manner as the body text (see below). Please note that these Instructions are typed just like the manuscripts should be. The abstract must have of 150-200 words, supplying general information about the achievements, and objectives of the paper, experimental technique, methods applied, significant results and conclusions. The text should be printed on the paper 21 x 29.7 cm (A4 format), with margins of 2 cm.

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**Key words:** up to 5 characteristic words explaining the subject of the paper

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### 1. INTRODUCTION

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This paper contains instructions for preparing manuscripts for the Conference Power Plants 2010. The text, not exceeding 10 pages, should be prepared in .DOC format (using MSWORD) and send at e-mail address: e2010@drustvo-termicara.com

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### 2. INSTRUCTIONS

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The text should be typed as follows:

- title: Times New Roman, 14 pt, ALL CAPS, bold, 1 spacing, centered.
- authors: name, initials and family names; Times New Roman, 12 pt, bold, 1 spacing, centered.
- affiliation(s): Times New Roman, 12 pt, bold italic, 1 spacing, centered;
- abstract: Times New Roman, 12 pt, 1 spacing, justified;
- body text: Times New Roman, 12 pt, 1 spacing, justified; paragraphs in sections (except the first one) should be indented right (tabulated) for 1 cm.
- section titles: Times New Roman, 12 pt, ALL CAPS, bold, 1 spacing, left, numerated in Arabic numbers (except ACKNOWLEDGMENTS and REFERENCES), one line should be left blank above and below section title.

- subsection titles: Times New Roman, 12 pt, bold, 1 spacing, left, numerated in heading numbering style in accordance to the section (e.g. 2.1., see below), one line should be left blank above subsection title.
- figure captions: Times New Roman, 11 pt, bold, single spacing, centered (if one line) or justified (if more than one line), below figures;
- one line should be left blank below figure captions.
- table captions: Times New Roman, 11 pt, single spacing, justified, above tables; one line should be left blank below tables.
- in Tools-Options-Save use True Types Fonts  
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## 2.1. Additional instructions

Numerated figures and tables should be inserted in the text. Only black and white drawings and sharp photographs are acceptable. Letters in the figures should be 3 mm high.

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## REFERENCES

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References should be numbered in brackets in the order of referring in the text, e.g. [1], [2-5], etc. The full references should be listed in numerical order of citation in the text at the end of the paper (left alignment, hanging indentation).
